#### PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Ms. Peggy Asche, Board Secretary, reported that she received an email from Dr. Carl Christman requesting to speak to the Board. At this time, Dr. Christman addressed the Board with his concerns. Mr. Bill Perez also addressed the Board regarding Business Matters Item No. 15. There were no other comments via Zoom.

#### **PRESENTATION**

Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility Expansion Update.

Linda Jadeski, Engineering Services Manager, updated the Board on the SRF Loan funding stating that the general information package has been submitted and a Project Manager has been assigned. The technical package will be submitted next week followed by the financial package. The last package is the environmental package, a draft initial study and a mitigated declaration has been prepared. Once reviewed by Staff, a 30-day public review period will be held and then brought back to the Board for approval. An "Expression of Interest" was posted on PlanetBids for firms looking to participate in the project. The district received six (6) Design Build Team responses on April 30th and are currently under review. The district's consultant is currently preparing a "Request for Qualifications" for a Design Build Team for a progressive design build method that has been chosen for this project. Currently they are working on the SCADA integration, landscape architect, City of Rialto Planning and Fire Departments. The next steps are the CEQA draft review in May, and in June the public review will be issued followed by a release for request of qualifications from the Design Build Teams and the submittal of Environmental package for SRF loan application and the CEQA adoption by the Board of Directors in July. This concluded her update. No questions were asked.

Legislative Update and Funding Opportunities.

Naseem Farooqi, Public Affairs Manager, provided a brief update on Federal Funding opportunities. Mr. Farooqi stated that the district has been working with our Federal Lobbyist, David Turch and Associates in identifying some federal opportunities for some of the projects within our jurisdiction. Three projects were submitted for funding, to Congressman Pete Aguilar's office and two resubmitted to Congresswoman Norma Torres's office that are in her jurisdiction. Also, three projects were submitted to Senator Dianne Feinstein's office. The district has been notified from Congresswoman Norma Torres's office that out of one hundred projects her office received, the district has been selected as one of their top ten to submit to the Appropriations Committee. One of the projects submitted is the Bloomington Alley Way project and should know by July or August if the district will be awarded the \$2 million. It will be beneficial to the district as well as the residents in the unincorporated area of Bloomington. Other funding

opportunities are being reviewed at the federal level for infrastructure money as well as at the State level. President Hawkins stated that the Public Affairs Department is doing a great job and hopes to have a report from the State Lobbyist soon.
