




MR. SHAMINDRA "RICKEY" MANBAHAL APPOINTED INTERIM GENERAL MANAGER

ast month, the WVWD Board of Directors appointed Mr. Shamindra "Rickey" Manbahal as interim general manager. Having served the water district for over a year and a half as chief financial and administrative officer, "Rickey" Manbahal brings extensive experience in finance and government management to the position and has been critical to overseeing many of the agency's successful financial, transparency and accountability reforms. He has served as director of finance for several cities throughout California and previously even worked for the County of Los Angeles as an internal auditor. Mr. Manbahal has a Master's degree in Public Administration from California State Northridge and a bachelor's degree in accounting. In addition to his duties at WVWD, Manbahal also is a part-time lecturer at UCLA Extension, leading auditing, accounting and business management courses. Mr. Manbahal has been essential to WVWD's turnaround and success and are in good hands while the search for a permanent general manager is under way.



IEWORKS TO SPUR REGIONAL ECONOMIC EQUITY, CAREERS IN THE WATER AND WASTEWATER INDUSTRY

A ccording to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, water agencies like ours face a

significant number of retirements from water treatment plants and system operators over the next several, which could lead to a talent shortage for our growing industry. Experts within the Inland Empire project a total of 835 openings in critical local water industry occupations by 2023, so to address this problem, a group of Inland Empire utility agencies, educational institutions and community stakeholders have come together



to form IEWorks, a workforce development group that will train more candidates for these critical jobs.

Officially launching on April 1st, 2021, IEWorks will foster talent, diversity and jobs through apprenticeships, internships and career awareness opportunities in the region's water and wastewater industry. To fulfill this mission, IEWorks secured over \$1 million in funding from the U.S Department of Education and additional funding from the California High Road Training Partnership to support a full-time staff position, worker wages, supportive services, and technical assistance.

"I'm passionate about this initiative because my life changed as a result of targeted opportunities like these," said Western Municipal Water District Board Vice President Gracie Torres. "When I was a young single mom, I applied for a small Western Municipal Water District scholarship that changed the trajectory of my life. There are so many of us with local water agencies that are ready to move the Inland Empire forward together and invest in the lives of our people."




WVWD CELEBRATES EARTH DAY!
