

n December, West Valley Water District (WVWD) welcomed California Labor Secretary Natalie Palugyai to the Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility. Secretary Palugyai, the first Latina to serve as California Labor Secretary, recently issued a \$1 million state grant to fund IEWorks, our nonprofit organization that helps recruit and train jobseekers in underrepresented areas of Riverside and San Bernardino counties. Earlier this year, WVWD graduated its first class of interns through the program. During her visit, Secretary Palugyai toured the Roemer facility with IEWorks leadership, WVWD Board President Channing Hawkins and Western Municipal Water District Vice President Gracie Torres. WVWD extends its thanks to Secretary Palugyai for working to fund and grow our future water industry workforce.



HAWKINS AND TAYLOR ELECTIONS



The West Valley Water District (WVWD) Board of Directors reelected Board President Channing Hawkins. Hawkins is committed to continuing to provide accountability, transparency and local jobs for ratepayers in the region. During his tenure as Board President, Hawkins spearheaded reforms such as rigorous accounting and financial reporting measures, a new board policies and procedures manual and new water sustainability and efficiency projects. These reforms earned WVWD the Special Districts Leadership Foundation's Transparency Certificate of Excellence, an award which recognizes transparency in operations and governance of special districts. Hawkins also serves as president of IEWorks, a seven-agency strong regional workforce development consortium focusing on underrepresented areas of Riverside and San Bernardino counties. In addition to Hawkins' reelection, WVWD also elected Board Director Dr. Michael Taylor to serve as vice president.
