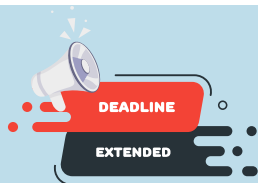


Advocating for our Customers, Communities and the Future

I'll never desert you. The summer months in California get hot! Consider planting succulents and other low-irrigation plant species.

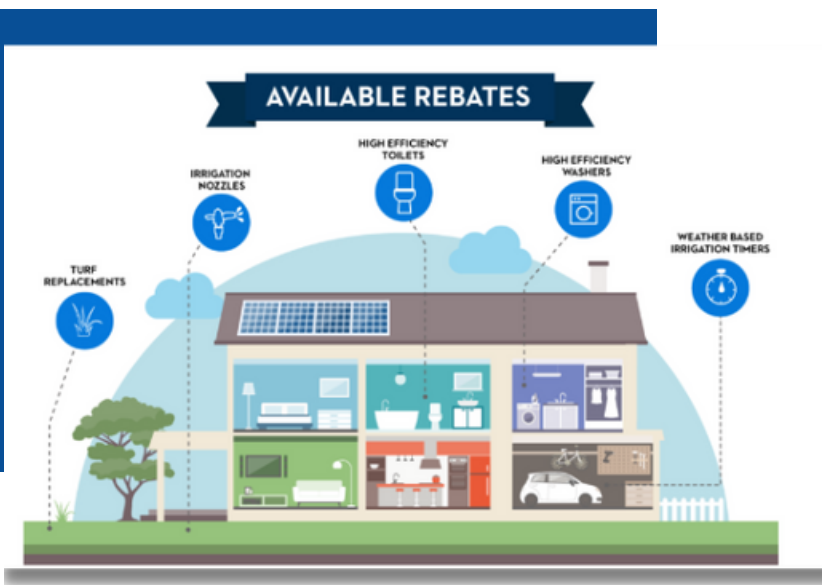


Love you so mulch. Mulch retains moisture, provides insulation for plants year-round and suppresses stubborn weeds.
