WVWD and WEWAC Award \$7,200 in Grants to Local Schools

The West Valley Water District (WVWD) Board of Directors is proud to announce that six Rialto Unified School District (RUSD) classrooms have received \$1,200 each through the Edubucks Program.

The funds were provided through WVWD's partnership with the Water Education Water Awareness Committee (WEWAC), whose mission is to promote water-use efficiency and to increase public awareness of the importance of water in Southern California.

All six winning schools used their winnings to send

fifth grade students on a science camp field trip to Skyland Ranch in Beaumont to learn about the importance of water and the environment.

Winning classrooms came from six different elementary schools within WVWD's service area, including Kordyak Elementary (Fontana), Trapp Elementary (Rialto), Fitzgerald Elementary (Rialto), Morgan Elementary (Rialto), Morris Elementary (Colton) and Hughbanks Elementary (Rialto).

The Edubucks Program awards up to \$1,200 for creative water-related educational software, activities, or supplies needed to assist Kindergarten to 12th grade teachers with the classroom or virtual learning environment.
